

Tenure Track Faculty Position in Theoretical Physics

The Department of Physics at Kent State University invites applications for a tenure-track Assistant Professor position in Theoretical Physics beginning Fall 2010. We wish to add support to one of two areas: (a) strong interaction theory related to nuclear matter at high energy density or temperature as typified by experiments such as at RHIC/LHC, or (b) condensed matter theory complementing existing strengths in the department, which include correlated and quantum matter, low temperature physics, and soft matter. Successful candidates will be expected to teach at the undergraduate and graduate levels, and carry out a productive research program that is likely to attract external funding.
